Class list and judging criteria

1. Display of seasonal produce. (Limited to one entry per project maximum size 70 x 70cm)

A selection of seasonal fruit and vegetables presented in a box or basket.

- Variety of produce
- Freshness and quality of produce
- Presentation of display

2. Best Display of Seasonal Cut Flowers and Foliage grown at your project

Judged on variety and appearance.

3. Potted annual

A pot grown annual plant or arrangement of annual plants in a pot

- Health and wellbeing of the plants
- Difficulty of cultivation
- Shape and appearance of plants
- Aesthetic appeal and arrangement of plants

4. Pollinator friendly plant

Presented in a container no larger than 5 litres. You may provide up notes on why it is pollinator friendly up to ½ A4.

- Health and wellbeing of the plants
- Difficulty of cultivation
- Usefulness to pollinators

5. Bouquet of Herbs (should be tied up)

- Variety
- Design and features of the container
- Aesthetic appeal and arrangement

6. Prettiest Pumpkin

Arrangement of up to 5 winter squashes/gourds (Cucurbita or [Lagenaria](#) – not including summer squashes) taking up no more than 24" (60cm) cubic volume

7. Best bouquet of tiny flowers/plants

Under the height of a pencil.

8. Miniature Garden Adult – must fit within a seed tray -maximum 3 entries per project)

A small container planted and landscaped to resemble a full size garden in miniature. Can include water features, hard landscaping and ornaments.

- Planting scheme and health of plants
- Other features

9. Miniature Garden Child - must fit within a seed tray -maximum 3 entries per project)

A small container planted and landscaped to resemble a full size garden in miniature. Can include water features, hard landscaping and ornaments.

- Imaginative design
- Planting scheme and health of plants
- Other features

10. Sweet Preserve

A sweet preserve (eg. jam, jelly or syrup) made by volunteers of the farm or garden (preferably with own produce). Max 4 per project Please provide recipe on A4

- Taste
- Texture
- Presentation

11 Savoury preserve

A savoury preserve (e.g. pickle, chutney or bottled vegetables) made by volunteers of the farm or garden (preferably with own produce). Max 4 entries per project. Please provide recipe on A4

- Taste
- Texture
- Presentation

12 Jar of Honey

One jar of honey made by bees on a farm or garden.

- Taste
- Appearance
- Presentation

Scoring and Prizes

Each category gets 3 points for first, 2 points for second, and 1 point for third. Please keep a record of which project was awarded which place.

At the end the points are tallied up and the project with the most points wins a horticulture plate for the year.
